Triple A World Junior Golf Series Brief

- The Triple A Series is designed to offer junior golfers the opportunity to display their skills over a series of golf tournaments, allowing college coaches in the US to view a junior golfer's performance over an extended period of time, matching that of an NCAA College Season.
- The Triple A World Junior Golf Series is a six-tournament series involving order of merit point accumulation, concluding with the Triple A Series World Final, to determine the Triple A World Series Champion.
- The Series consists of 6 three-day (54-hole) WAGR-ranked tournaments with U21 Boys and U21 Girls categories.
- The Series utilises/has utilised some of Europe's best courses, all located around the Sotogrande area in the south of Spain. Some of the courses include:
 - San Roque Old Course
 - San Roque Golf and Resort
 - Real Club de Golf Sotogrande
 - La Hacienda, Links Course
 - Finca Cortesin
 - La Reserva
- Triple A Series: The maximum field size for the Triple A WAGR Tournaments will be the sum of all the categories. Field capacity will vary depending on the tournament and hosting venue. NOTE: The Triple A World Series Final: The maximum field size for the Triple A World Series Final will be 60 players and will consist of the top 45 boys and top 15 girls in the order of merit.
- The Series takes place between September and April, offering junior golfers the opportunity to play a full series of tournaments during the European winter season, before their Summer seasons kick off.

1- Tournaments

All events are 3-day, 54-hole WAGR Tournaments

Five Triple A World Series:

- Triple A European Masters
- Triple A European Championship
- Triple A European Classic
- Triple A European Invitational
- Triple A European Open

Winners earn 1,000 Order of Merit Points.

The Triple A World Series Final:

- Top 60 & ties in the Order of Merit Qualify

Winners earn 2,000 points.

2- Participants

The competition is open to all golfers holding a valid golf license from the Royal Spanish Golf Federation or a handicap certificate issued by their country's golf federation. Eligible players must have a maximum handicap of 20 at the time of registration.

3- Categories

Triple A World Series:

- U21 - Men's (WAGR)
- U21 - Women's (WAGR)

Triple A World Series Final:

- U21 - Men's (WAGR)
- U21 - Women's (WAGR)

4- Rules

The competition will be played according to the golf rules as approved and applied by the R&A. Tournament conditions, local golf course rules and additional rules put into force by the tournament committee will also apply.

5- Code of Conduct: Players, Parents, Spectators

All players, parents, and spectators are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful and sportsmanlike manner at all times. In junior events, players are responsible for the behaviour of their parents and spectators.

Any behaviour deemed by tournament officials to be unsportsmanlike, disruptive, or disrespectful toward the hosting golf course staff, Jason Floyd Golf Academy (JFGA) team members, fellow competitors, the Triple A Tournament Series, or the golf course may result in disciplinary action. Such action may include a warning, penalty, disqualification of the player, and/or removal of the offending individual(s) from the premises.

Unsportsmanlike conduct includes but is not limited to: throwing or slamming clubs, damaging the golf course or facilities, failure to observe proper golf etiquette, abusive or offensive language, yelling, intimidation, deliberate miss-counting of shots, coaching or interference during play (unless permitted), or any behavior that misrepresents or brings discredit to the Jason Floyd Golf Academy, the Triple A Tournament Series or the host venue.

Tournament officials reserve the right to determine appropriate disciplinary action in the best interest of the competition and the spirit of the game.

By registering for a Triple A Series event, parents and guardians acknowledge their responsibility to uphold the spirit of the game and agree that breaches of this Code of Conduct & Safeguarding Policy by parents, guardians, or spectators may result in player penalties, including disqualification and dismissal from future Triple A Series Golf Events.

In the event of any unresolved issues, parents should speak to the Triple A Series Directors in private at an agreed time, and not in front of children.

6- Format

All Triple A World Junior Golf Series Tournaments will be a Medal/Stroke Play format.

Triple A World Series:

- U21 → 3 day, 54 Hole Medal Play Tournaments (There is no cut)

Triple A World Series Final:

- U21 → 3 day, 54 Hole Medal Play Tournament (There is no cut)

7- Registrations

Entries must be received by JFGA no later than 30 days before the first day of the tournament. JFGA reserves the right to manage all entries and determine the final field. The list of participants and tee times for Rounds 1 and 2 will be published the day before the tournament.

Entries will be accepted based on handicap.

Should the number of participants be reduced due to circumstances beyond the control of the Club or the Committee (including adverse weather, public order, or other force majeure), entry fees will be refunded if the competition cannot commence. The Committee shall not be liable for any additional expenses incurred by players.

No refunds will be made for cancellations within 48 hours of the start of the tournament, except in duly justified cases of force majeure, at the sole discretion of the Committee.

In the event of a waiting list, priority will be given to players holding the best WAGR ranking on that list. From there, lowest handicapped players will fill any remaining spots in the field.

8- Tournament Entry Fees

The Entry fees will be determined by the JFGA and paid to the Academy/Triple A Series.

9- Cancellations

Cancellations made within 31 calendar days before the first tee time on day 1 will not be refunded. This is due to the golf clubs requiring pre-payments long in advance of the tournament start dates.

10- Field Sizes

Triple A Series:

The maximum field size for the Triple A WAGR Tournaments will be the sum of all the categories, and capacity will vary depending on the tournaments.

Triple A World Series Final:

The maximum field size for the Triple A World Series Final will be 60 players and will consist of the top 60 in the order of merit.

*The Order of Merit Top 60 will be made up of:

- U21 Boys: Top 45
- U21 Girls: Top 15

11- Start times and groups

Days 1 and 2: Groups will be organised by gender and in handicap order, with the lowest handicaps starting first. The Tournament Committee will determine if the Boys or Girls will tee off first for each day.

Day 3: Groups will be organised in leaderboard order with leaders going out last unless the tournament committee determines otherwise.

*In the event of a tie for 1st place, a sudden death playoff will take place. If weather or daylight is determined by the tournament committee to disallow a playoff, then 1st place will be determined by a count back. 2nd and 3rd places will be decided on count back regardless of any inclement conditions.

12- Tees

Teeing grounds for each category will be organised and decided by the tournament committee.

13- Trophies and prizes

The JFGA will award prizes to the following finish positions:

Top 3 Best Scratch players U21 (Boys and Girls)

14- Committee

The committee will be made up of JFGA members of staff.

15- Practice Round

Reservations directly with the Club.

16- Starting Times

Times will be published 24-48 hours before the 1st round by email.

17- WAGR

The tournament will count for WAGR if there are at least 16 players in the male category and 8 in the female category. If the minimum is not reached, the tournament will be mixed.

18- Caddies

Caddies are not allowed in any category. However, spectators can serve as forecaddies.

19- Parents/Spectators, Additional Rules:

Parents and Spectators must abide by the code of conduct policies listed above and follow all rules and regulations of the hosting venue.

Additionally, all spectators must stay off fairways, tees and greens, follow the cart path, and walk at least 50 meters in front of the group that they are watching. No signaling where to hit the ball is allowed. No approaching the ball after it has been hit. The player is allowed 3 minutes to look for his/her ball. Spectators can only help once the player is within range. Spectators are not allowed to approach the ball and pick it up to identify the ball, this is for the player to do.

20- Buggies

The use of buggies is not permitted for players. Spectators may use them if the venue allows. However, the tournament committee reserves the right to shuttle players for inclement weather or pace of play concerns as they see fit.

21- Push & pull trolley/Cart

Limited number available. Must be reserved directly at the Club.

22- Technical Equipment

A player can use a device (GPS/Laser) to obtain information with regard to distance using technical equipment that measures exclusively distance.

If, during a round, a player is found using a device that is designed to also calculate or measure any other condition and information that could affect their game (elevation, wind speed, temperature, etc.), the player is in breach of the rules. The penalty will be 2 shots on the first time and disqualification if repeated. Additionally, green reading books are disallowed at all Triple A Events.

23- Suspension

If a round cannot be played, the Committee will decide how to proceed. In any case, the organisation will not be held responsible when the cause is due to the Club's decision or force majeure.

24- Anti-Doping Regulations

According to Organic Law 11/2021 and its Development Regulation approved by Royal Decree 792/2023, and current regulation, athletes with a state license must undergo testing both in and out of competition when determined by the Spanish Commission for Anti-Doping in Sport (CELD).

25- Data Protection and Image Rights

In accordance with the GDPR (EU) 2016/679 on the protection of personal data and the free movement of such data, and through the completion of this form, you must grant AUTHORISATION for the personal data of the MINOR to be included in a file owned by JASON FLOYD GOLF ACADEMY, to manage the MINOR's participation in the Performance Programme promoted by Jason Floyd Golf, SL and carry out the necessary administrative operations for payments/collections and other notifications related to said event. We also request your express consent to process your data for the following purposes:

- To keep you informed through electronic means (SMS, telephone, email) about news regarding services, offers, the holding of activities and events, among others, promoted by JASON FLOYD GOLF SL.
- Capture your image and include it in photographic or audiovisual material, and publish it on the website: www.jasonfloydgolfacademy.com or other promotional material used by JASON FLOYD GOLF SL, to promote the activities and services offered by our academy. 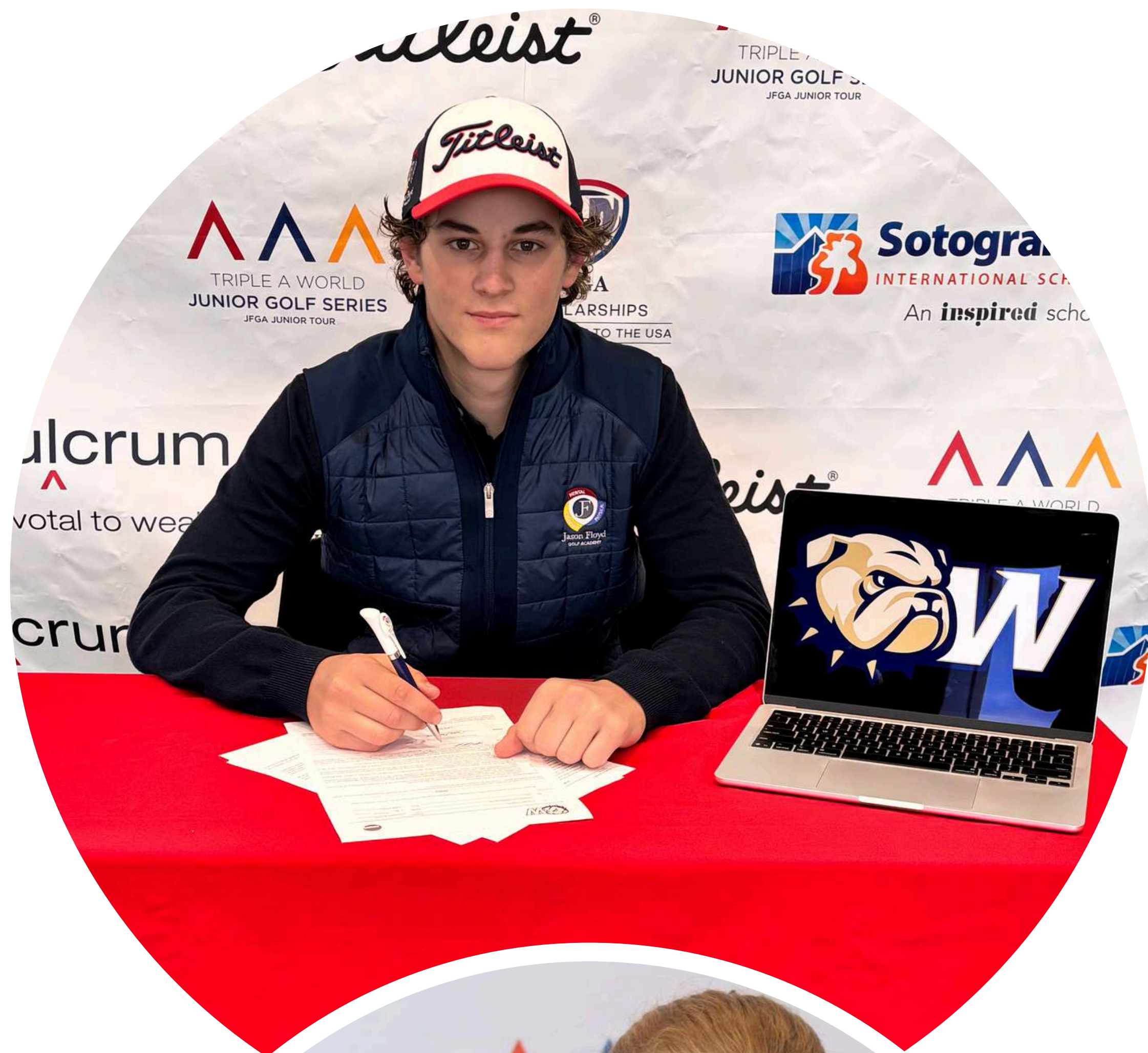
